

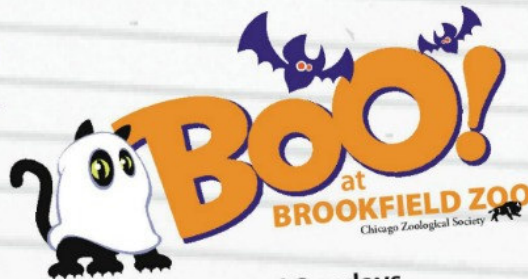

Brookfield Zoo CREATURES OF THE NIGHT

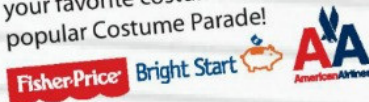
Fridays, Saturdays, and Sundays,

popular Costume Parade!

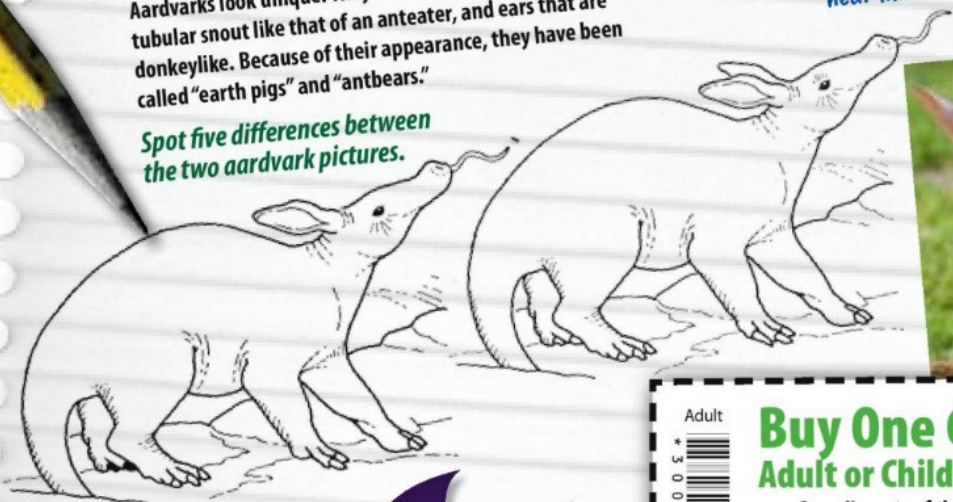


A IS FOR AARDVARK

Many animals are "nocturnal," meaning they are more active at night.
Aardvarks are one of them. They sleep during the day and come out at
night to hunt for food such as ants and termites.

Aardvarks look unique. They have a piglike body, a long,
tubular snout like that of an anteater, and ears that are
donkeylike. Because of their appearance, they have been
called "earth pigs" and "antbears."

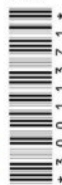
