Consumers and Producers



Buying and Selling

People buy and sell goods and services every day. People who buy or use things are called consumers. People who make or sell things are called producers.

Producing Goods

Producers sell goods they grow or make. Farmers are producers when they sell the fruits and vegetables they grow. A toy company is a producer when it sells the toys it makes.

Producing Services

Producers offer their time and skills by selling services.

Doctors are producers when they give people checkups.

Taxi drivers are producers when they give people rides.

Consuming Goods

Consumers buy all sorts of goods. Consumers buy small goods like clothes, toys, and food. They also buy large goods such as boats and houses.

Consuming Services

Consumers spend money on many types of services.
They pay to have their cars washed at a gas station.
Consumers also spend money to have someone fix their bicycles.

service - work that helps others
