Any resident of the city of Joliet may apply for a library card at the Circulation desk at either library location. Applicants must present either a current government issue photo ID that verifies their name and current address, or a general photo ID in addition to proof of residency verifying their name and current address. Additional proof of residency is required if the current address is not on the ID. For a list of accepted documents, please contact us at 815-740-2660. Children 3 years old and up may apply for their own library card with parental consent.

#### **Parking**
